

## Heritage Trail

- 1 Evidence of the clay industry on site, from the 1920s to 1960s.
- 2 Randall Manor, the site of a buried medieval manor.
- 3 The Hollow Way – a medieval track.
- 4 Prehistory sculpture: evidence of our Mesolithic ancestors.
- 5 Carriage Drive, which once led to Cobham Hall.
- 6 World War 2 Royal Air Force camp.
- 7 World War 2 Army camp (no information board).

## Explorer Trail

- 1 **Darnley Mausoleum** The Grade 2 listed mausoleum, built in 1786, can be seen on the hillside opposite from this point.
- 2 **Ponds and wetlands** The ponds in this clay pit area are home to great crested newts, 19 species of dragonfly and damselfly, and at night daubenton bats feed on insects.
- 3 **Coppice woodland** The rotational cutting of sweet chestnut allows light to reach the woodland, promoting wild flowers. The variety of age of trees encourages small mammals, butterflies and birds.
- 4 **Woodland rides and glades** These open corridors connect areas of woodland. They allow sunlight into the wood and enable wildlife to spread through the park.
- 5 **Wood pasture and acid grassland** The veteran trees provide habitat for insects and birds, including the green, and lesser spotted woodpeckers. Bracken is controlled by cutting and grazing, allowing grass and herbs to flourish.
- 6 **Ancient woodland** These old trees are home to a wide variety of plants and animals. Lichen and mosses grow on the bark, where cracks are home to beetles and other insects.
- 7 **The clay pit** Here the silver birch trees shelter the newer oaks, sweet chestnut and hornbeam, which will eventually return the area to semi-natural woodland. In autumn, the pit is filled with fungi

**By car** – signposted off the A2 between Gravesend and Rochester, at the Cobham/Shorne junction. Pay and display car park available.

**By bus** - take the Nu Venture Gravesend to Meopham/Cliffe service (numbers 416 and 417). It runs Monday to Saturday and stops at the park entrance. Phone Traveline: 0871 200 22 33.

**By train** – the nearest stations are Sole Street (2.6miles, 4.2km) and Higham (3miles, 4.8km). For rail enquiries phone 08457 48 49 50.

-  **Easy Access Trail** - A 1km circular trail through birch woodland, lakes and grassy glades
-  **Easy Access Extension** - Direct linear routes to the Knoll view point and Randall Manor from the Easy Access Trail
-  **Purple Route** - An easy - medium route, 1.4km long
-  **Red Route** - A medium - difficult route, 3.1km long (Includes steps)
-  **Explorer Trail** - A challenging route, 6km long. (Includes steps)
-  **The Darnley Trail** - The 10km Darnley Trail is a circular route for pedestrians, cyclists and equestrians.
-  **Heritage Trail** - A medium - difficult route, 3.5km long (Includes steps)
-  **Horse/Cycle/Pedestrian Route** - This is a 3km circular route, with extensions that link to permissive bridleways outside the park
