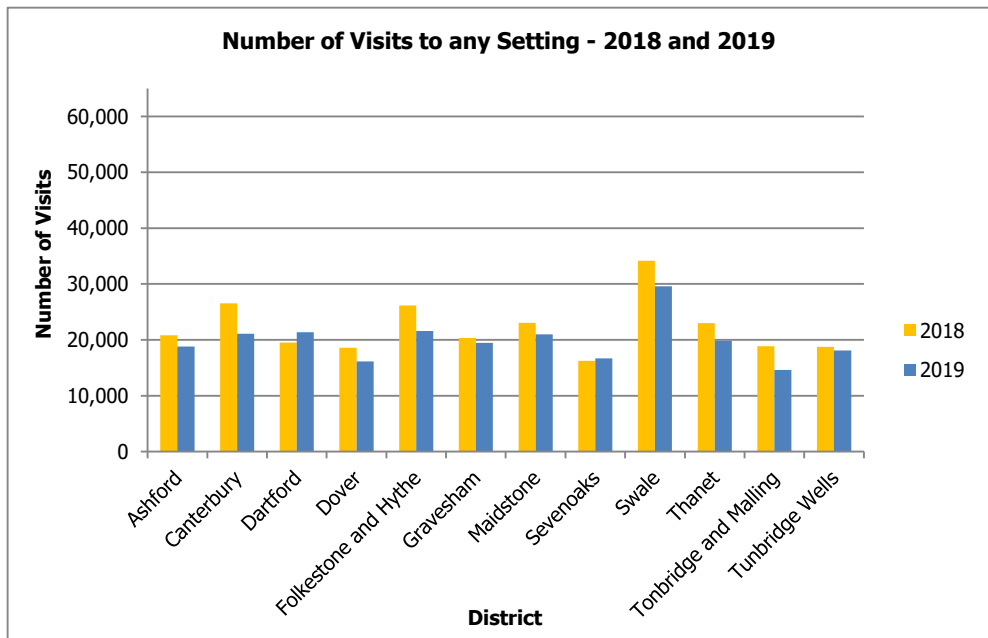
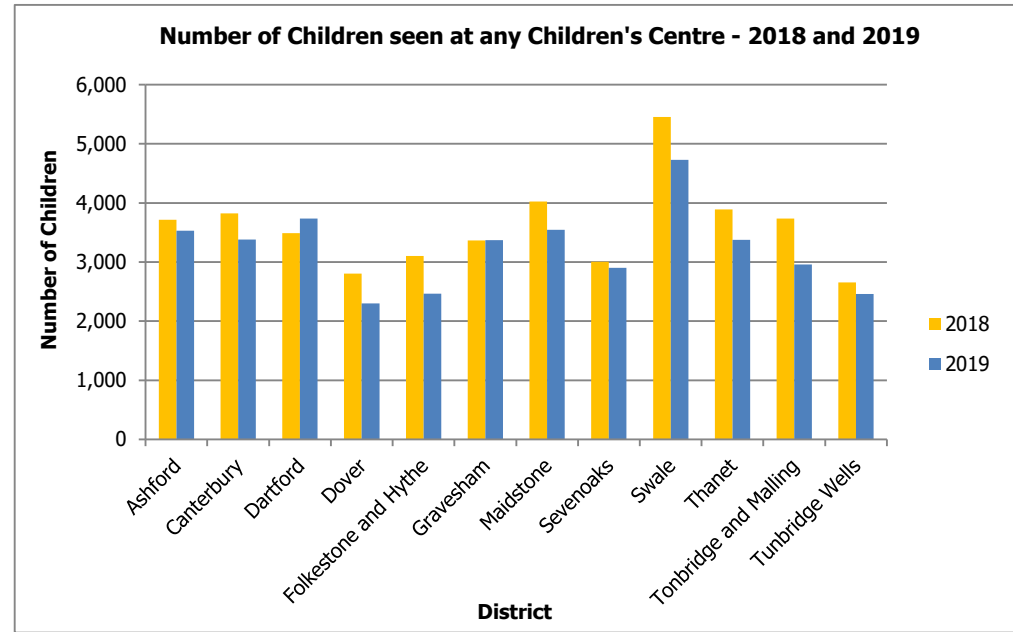

Early Years Foundation Stage Profile - Attainment Gap Trends 2017 to 2019



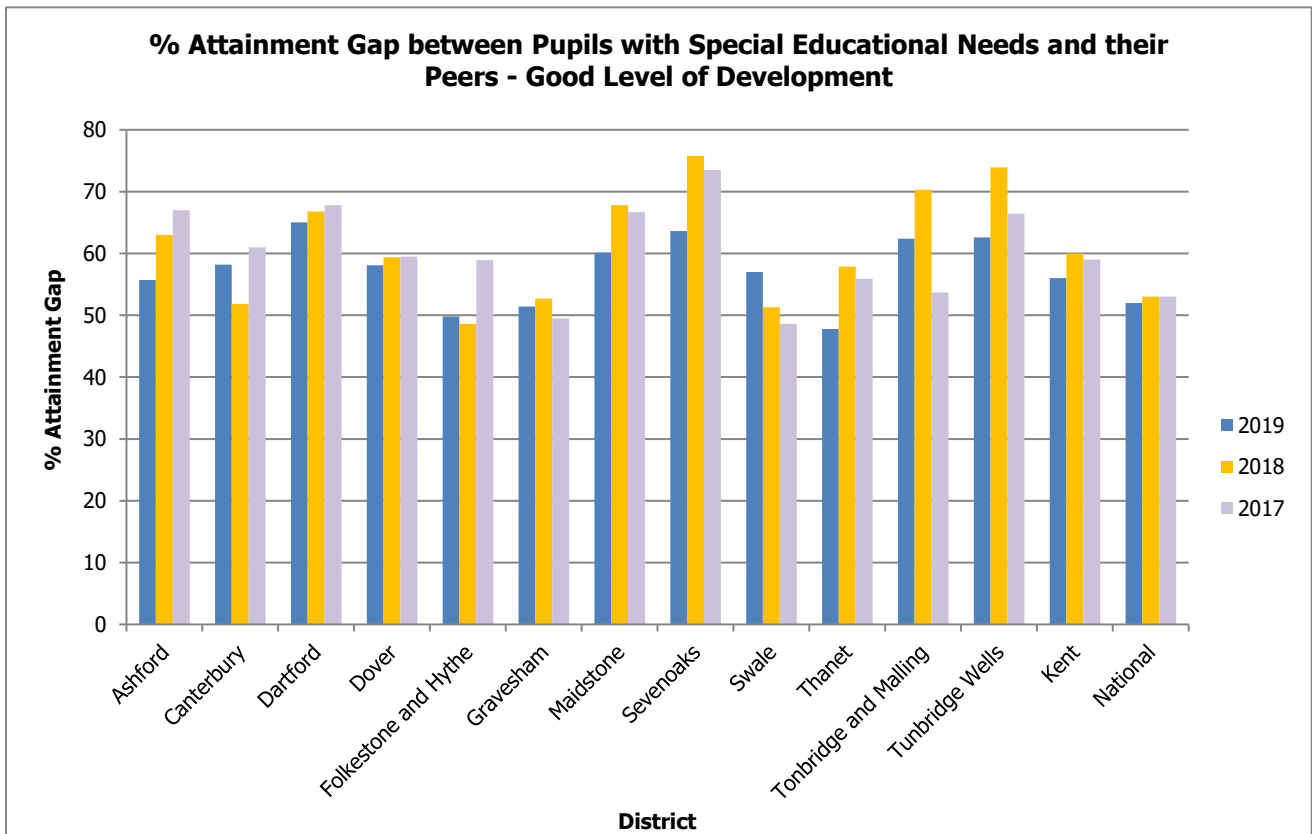

Key Stage One Trend by District - 2017 to 2019



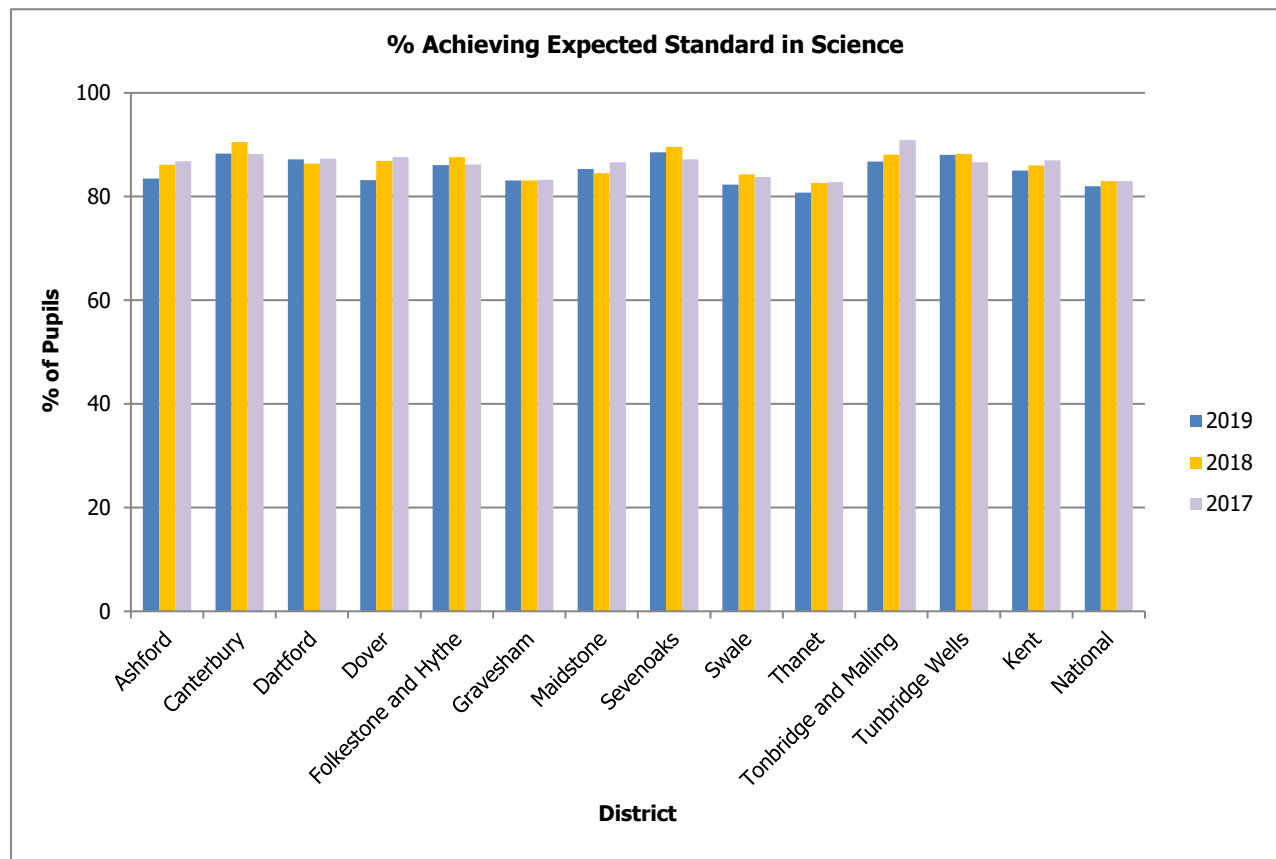
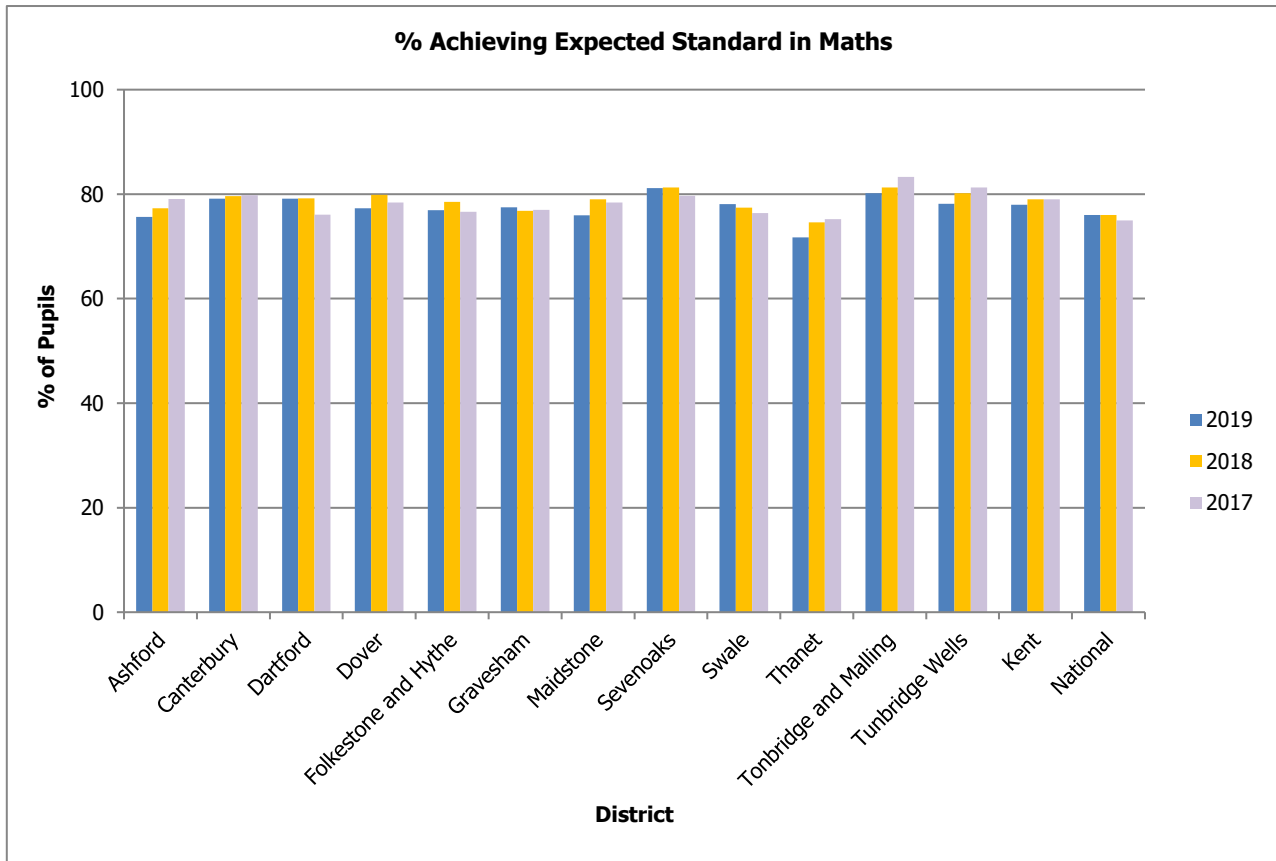

Key Stage Two Attainment by District 2019



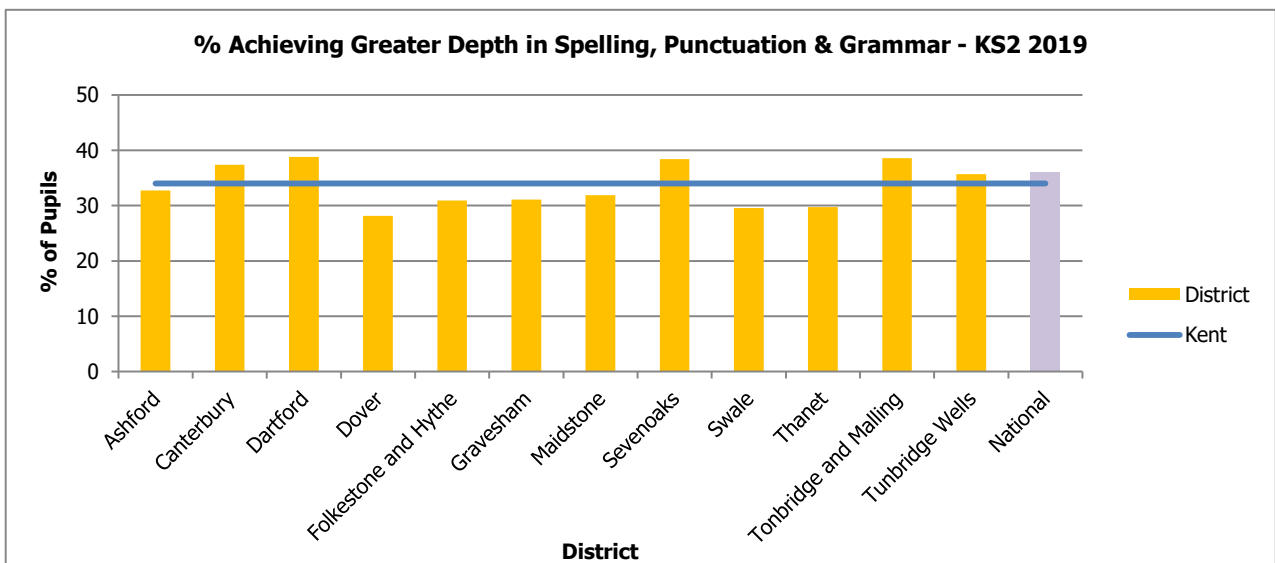
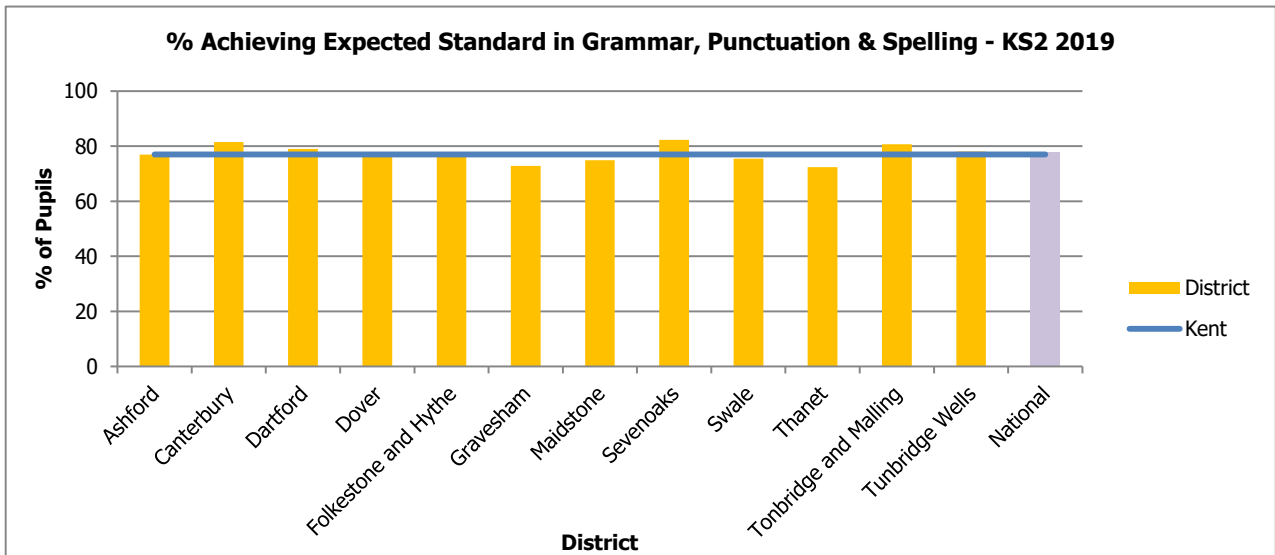

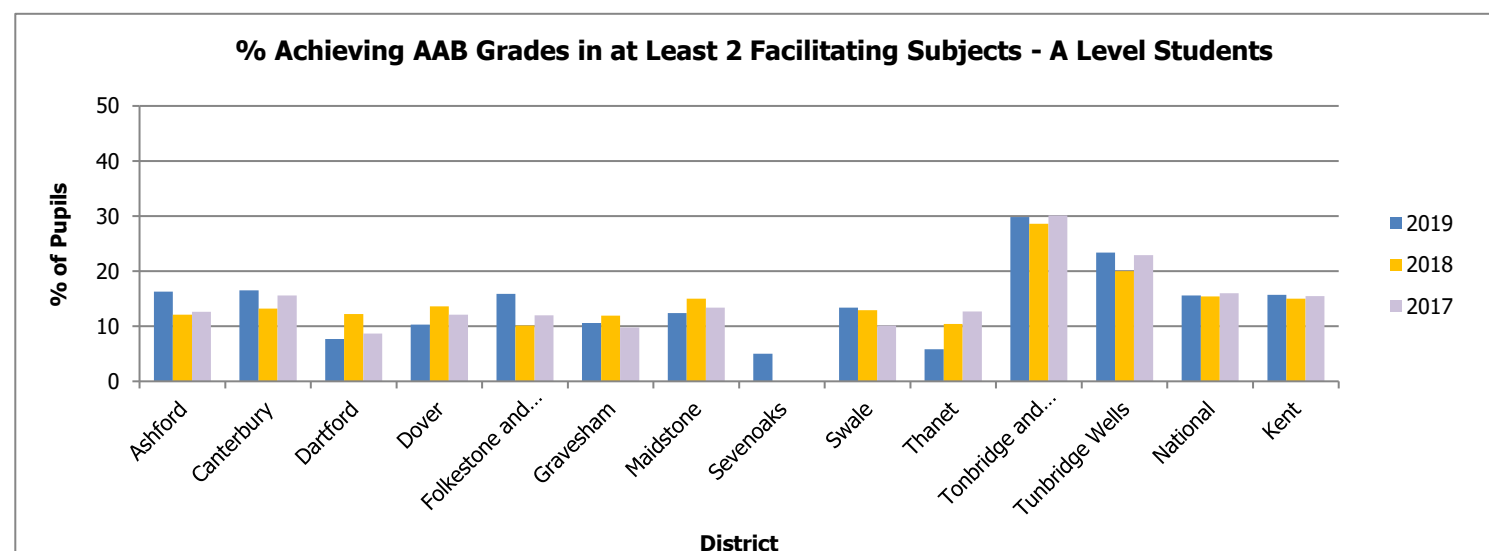

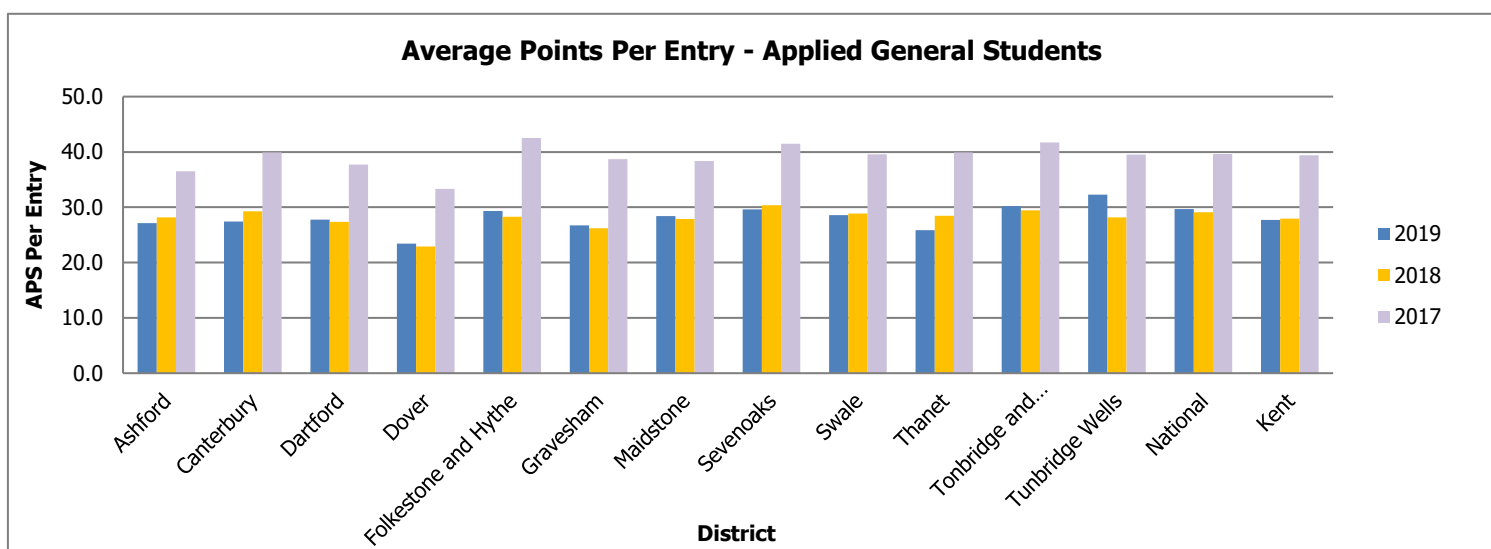

Ofsted Kent and National Trends - % of Good or Outstanding Schools (Overall Effectiveness)

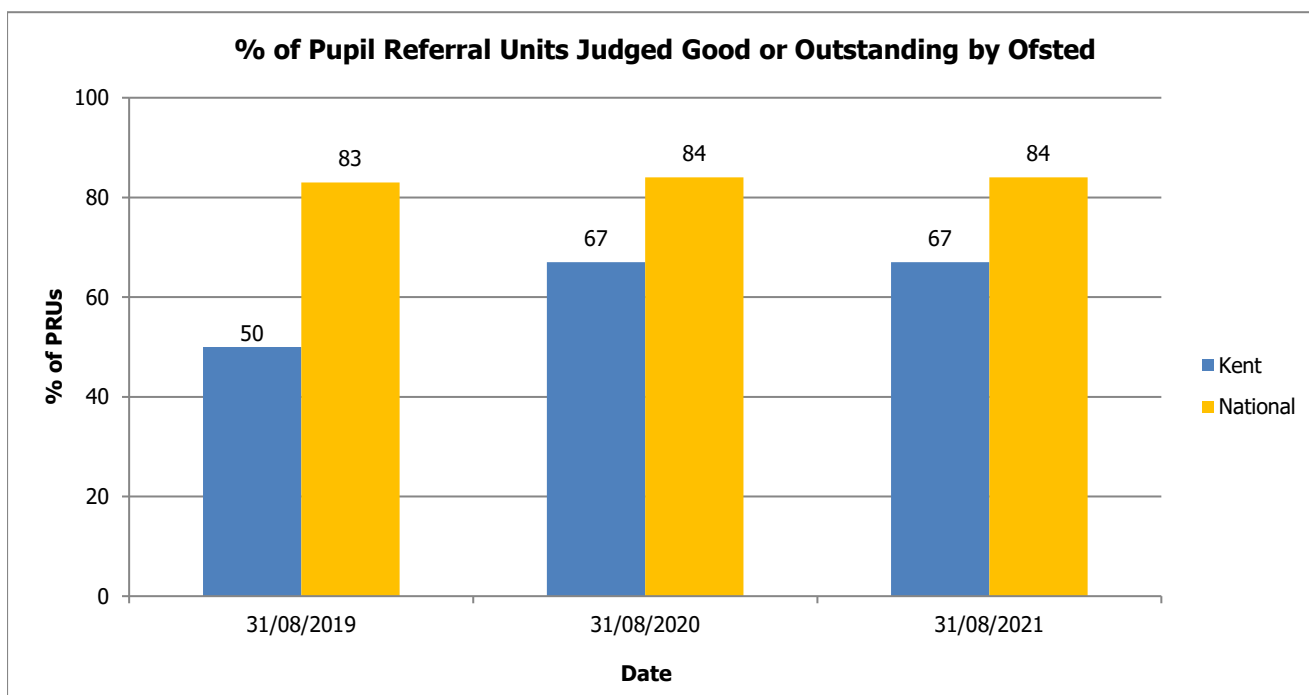
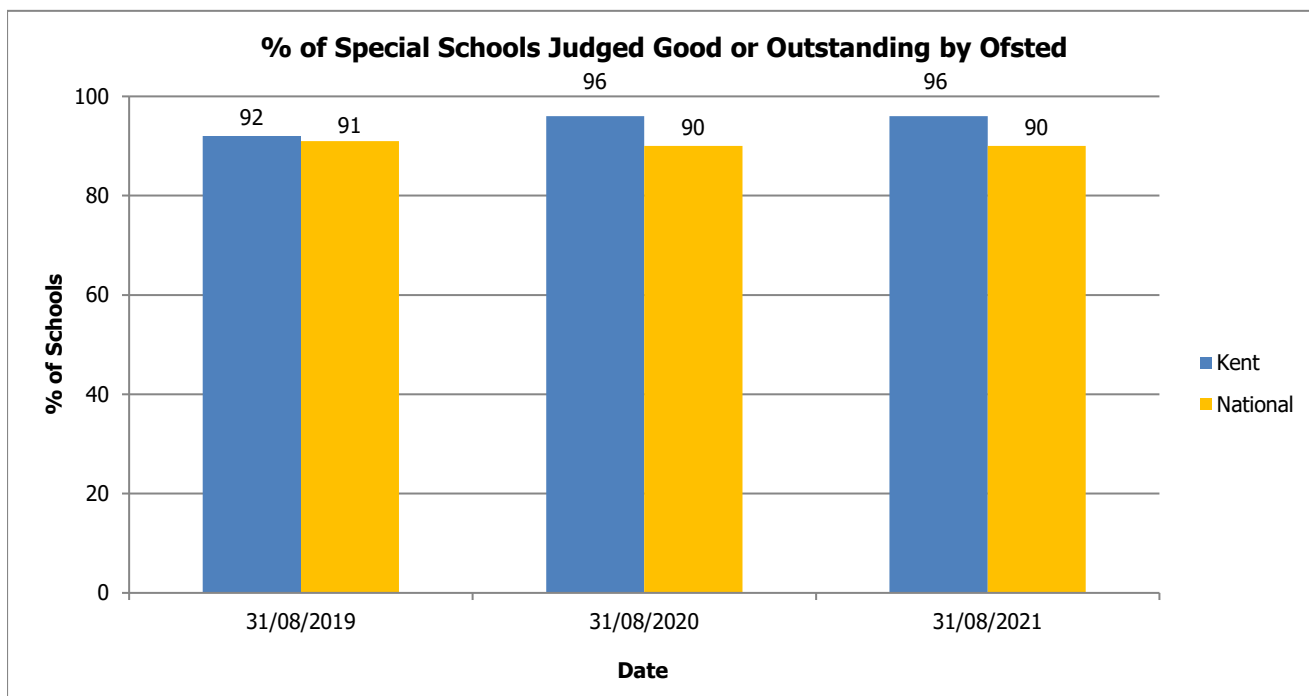
