## Virtual School Advisory Team

### New Year Attendance.

We have heard of some amazing work being undertaken by schools, social workers, and professionals working together to increase school attendance and, in some cases, reduce the risk of exclusions for some of our most vulnerable young people - thank you for all the effort that you are putting in for this cohort of young people.



Social Workers and Early Help workers have all recently had the opportunity to undertake attendance training delivered by PIAS, KEPs, Social Services and VSK and have access to the EBSA training when required.

If you have young people who currently have a social worker, or Early Help worker, please ensure that plans to support with attendance are clearly laid out within statutory and planning meetings and that the professional working with the young person is aware of the attendance and EBSA training available to them. For Previously Looked After Children, EPPLAC meetings (Education Plan for Previously Looked After Children) can be a useful tool to consider their previous care experience within the context of any current attendance needs. For those who previously had a social worker (within the last 6 years) please use the Breakthrough Meeting template available on KELSİ.

After an exciting festive period of Christmas arts and crafts workshops, parties and a 'Christmas Show in a Day' with our young people, the Participation Team are now turning their attention to terms 3 and 4!



### February School Holiday Activities

The February school holiday is already shaping up to be a great one with some exciting activities for both Kent Children in Care and adopted young people living in Bexley, Kent and Medway. During the week, young people will be able to enjoy a 'Space Day' in Ashford with themed experiments, arts and crafts and an immersive astrodome experience, the latter led by the University of Kent. We are also looking forward to two multi-sports activity days taking place in Medway and led by Strive PE and Sport, a teacher led organisation that specialises in primary, secondary and SEND sport.

### Young People's Council Groups

And, of course, all of our Young People's Council Groups will be meeting during the school holiday to share their views and opinions and get their voices heard!

Our **Children in Care Councils (Super Council** for 7 – 11 year olds and **Our Children and Young People's Council** for 11 – 16 year olds) will be meeting in Maidstone and Margate during the week. These groups are opportunities for young people with lived experience of care to share their ideas about how to make it better for all young people, allowing them to contribute to positive changes for everyone. The group will also enjoy lunch and a visit from some creepy crawlies and reptiles as part of an animal encounter experience!

The **Adoptables** for Adopted Young People aged 11 – 16 living in Bexley, Kent and Medway will also meet. This council group allows young people to talk about adoption and how to make it the very best it can be for young people and their families with everything they say shared with VSK and Adoption Partnership South East. This February, we are excited to take them to the Big Cat Sanctuary in Smarden for their meeting and a private tour to see the lions and tigers.

Another group visiting the Big Cat Sanctuary this February, is our **OCYPC MAGIC** group for young people aged 11 – 18 with SEND. This group is open to Children in Care, adopted young people and young people with a social worker. A newer group, this council allows young people to share their views about learning, education and wellbeing in a safe, inclusive and supportive environment.

And last but not least, the **Children WHO Care Council** for the children of foster carers will meet in Ashford to share their views about how fostering impacts the whole family and the important role they play in the fostering journey. They will also have the chance to get creative and paint some pottery too in an arts and crafts workshop!

### Other Ways to Engage

The Participation Team are also keen to meet with young people who want to share their views about the services they receive from KCC and other professionals but may not be able to or want to come to a regular group meeting. The Team can meet with young people individually in person at a venue that suits them or virtually, or young people can submit written or drawn feedback to us.
