# From September 2017 many three and four year olds can benefit from Free Early Education and Childcare being exfended from 15 to 30 hours. All three and four years olds will continue to receive up to $\mathbf{1 5}$ hours free. 

To be eligible for 30 Hours of Free Childcare, both parents (or the sole parent in a single parent family) will need to earn on average the equivalent of 16 hours on the national minimum wage and no more than $£ 100,000$ per year. Your eligibility will be checked by HMRC. Please visit the website for detailed eligibility criteria.
