The figures include Y12 & Y13 (academic age 16 & 17) with a Kent County Council area postcode as their primary address.

The 2016 NEET and NK figures do not have weighting from September

Headline Commentary

The NEET population has risen slightly to 3.2% this month (1,075 young people), and the Not Knowns have risen to 5.5%. At the same point last year, the equivalent figures were 4.5% NEET and 5.6% Not Knowns, so significant improvement has been made, particularly in reducing the NEET cohort. At this time of year there is always a rising proportion of Not Knowns as young people are at a transition point for courses and their new destinations have not yet been collected from education providers.

The NEET population of 1,075 young people comprises 461 in the year 12 age group and 614 in the year 13 age group.

The Participation rate has decreased slightly from last month, down to 88.2%, but this is 2.4 percentage points higher than the same point last year.

Schools and colleges have been submitting their offers made to young people for places on courses starting in September. Currently, there are 4.1% of Year 11 pupils, and 12.8% of Year 12 pupils, without a September Guarantee. This is a significant improvement on last month figures, and compared to the same point last year, this is an improved position for both year groups. In total, 8.5% of this combined cohort are currently without an offer, compared to 11.3% in August 2016. Work is ongoing with schools and colleges to increase the number of pupils with a September Guarantee, with a key focus on supporting those in vulnerable groups.

District performance for NEET varies from 1.7% in Sevenoaks to 4.5% in Swale, though most districts are between 2.5% and 3.5%. NEET proportions fell in Dover, Sevenoaks, Shepway and Thanet, and remained the same in Ashford, whilst they rose slightly in all other districts. District performance for Not Knowns is more varied than usual this month, and ranges from 3.9% in Tunbridge Wells to 7.1% in Ashford. The number of Not Knowns rose in all districts this month, in line with seasonal expectations at this time of year due to course end dates. 73% of NEET young people have been NEET for 27 weeks or more, up from 72% last month. In the same month last year this figure was 79%. Although our overall NEET population is reducing, there remains a significant proportion of young people whose NEET status is hard to shift, and work is taking place to develop creative ways to engage the long-term NEET population.

Work has taken place to ensure we have contact details for the full NEET and Not Known cohorts. It can be a challenge to maintain monitoring and support when young people's details can change regularly, and this work should mean that we can make contact with a greater number of our NEET and Not Known young people.

Districts worked closely with schools to support young people on GCSE results day to ensure that young people who did not achieve their expected results received appropriate advice and guidance for progression into post-16 education and training.

Statistical Neighbours NEETs July2017

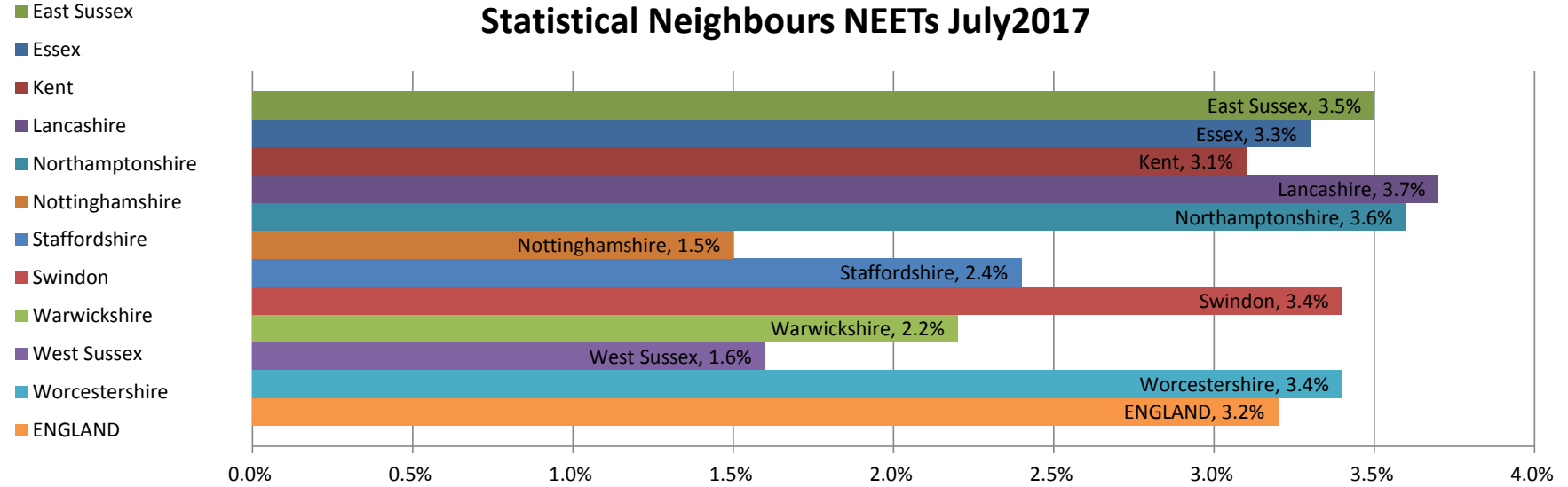
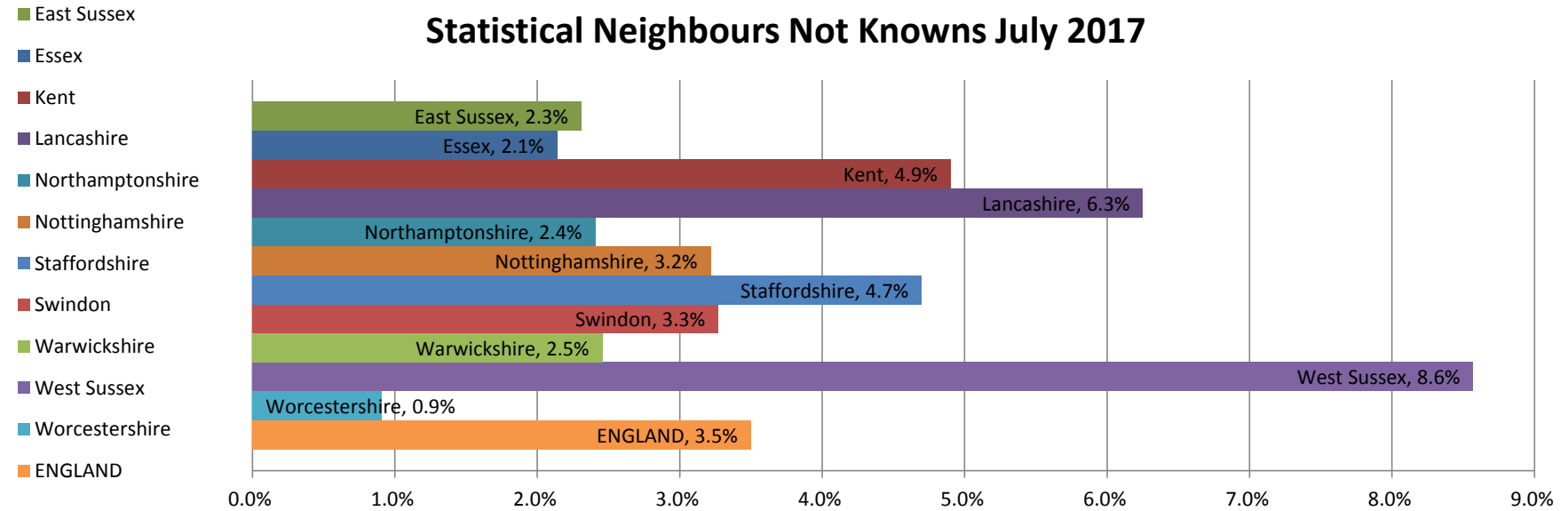
