- Pupils whose parent(s) are in the armed forces (Service Children) they have been registered as a 'service child' at any point in time within the last 6 years (Ever6SC)

Ever6FSM

The DfE Ever6 FSM Autumn 2020 report (Please see information below).

This report will provide all the pupils currently eligible for Ever6 FSM funding for the new financial year. The report **must** be checked for accuracy before actual pupil numbers are added to the funding template. Deduct those pupils who are funded differently under pupil premium - Children in Care (CIC), Adopted (Post Lac) children.

When using this report remember to exclude any pupils whose date of admission was after the census date as well as these will not be funded until the following financial year. Exclude any out of county children where pupil premium is funded directly by another local authority.

The release of the Keys2Success information later in the year may mean adjustments are made to the schools funding via the statement of account (monthly advance).

The report will be relevant for Year 1 but estimates of pupils will need to be entered into Years 2 and 3.

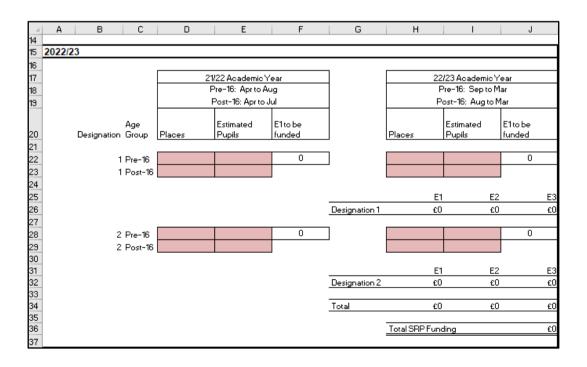

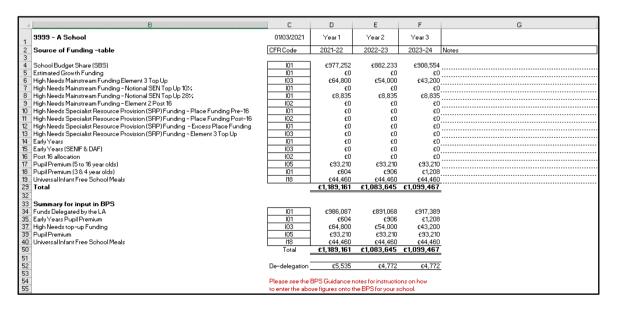
