







Key Stage Two Trend by District - 2017 to 2019








Table 3i Key Stage Four Attainment by District 2019












Key Stage Four Attainment by District 2019








Key Stage Four Trend by District - 2017 to 2019









Table 3k Key Stage Four Trend by District - 2017 to 2019






Post-16 Attainment by District 2019









Post 16 Trend by District - 2017 to 2019












