Sound Progress is a website that helps you run precision teaching for word level literacy skills. It does all the hard work for you, recording progress and creating a chart. It is evidence based and compatible with any systematic synthetic approach to word level literacy skills. It helps build accuracy and fluency both in the early stages of learning literacy for the first time and with children who are finding it difficult and need the more fine gained approach that precision teaching can bring.

It was developed by Kent Educational Psychology Service and has been used by 100s of schools to support 1000s of children around the UK.

The new *intervention summary* feature allows you to generate a report of what has been covered during an intervention and what progress has been made.

The summary helps give an overview of what a child has mastered and what they are still finding difficult.

It can be used to celebrate progress as well as in discussions with other professionals to let you analyse progress, explore how the intervention went and consider what to do next.

Use the summary to show you;

- How long the intervention was.
- Which tasks you covered.
- How well the child did on each one.
- How many tasks you did overall, with weekly and daily average data.
- It also lets you enter pre and post intervention assessments to help gauge progress.
