Changes to Guidance on Lateral Flow Testing for Schools

Many of you may have seen the media coverage over the weekend related to the change in procedure when a student or member of staff has tested positive after taking a Lateral Flow Test in school. The guidance was previously that this should be followed up with a PCR test and that if this returned a positive then the procedure for self-isolation, isolation of the household and close contacts should be initiated. Guidance has now changed to state that a positive Lateral Flow Test result following a school-based test is sufficient for the self-isolation process to be initiated and that a follow-up PCR test is not required. However if a home-based Lateral Flow test returns a positive, this should be followed up with a PCR test and if that returns a negative result, then those self-isolating can come out of isolation.
