# Headline Commentary

The NEET population has fallen slightly to 3.2% this month (1,074 young people), though the Not Knowns have risen to 4.1%. At the same point last year, the equivalent figures were 4.1% NEET and 4.6% Not Knowns, so significant improvement has been made in reducing both cohorts.

The NEET population of 1,074 young people comprises 421 in the year 12 age group and 653 in the year 13 age group.

The Participation rate has decreased slightly from last month, down to 89.1%, but this is 1.9 percentage points higher than the same point last year.

Schools and colleges have been submitting their offers made to young people for places on courses starting in September. Currently, there are 10.5% of Year 11 pupils, and 26.0% of Year 12 pupils, without a September Guarantee. Compared to the same point last year, this is an improved position for both year groups. In total, 18.4% of this combined cohort are currently without an offer, compared to 23.0% in June 2016. Further work is taking place with schools and colleges to increase the number of pupils with a September Guarantee, with a key focus on supporting those in vulnerable groups.

District performance for NEET varies from 1.8% in Sevenoaks to 4.5% in Thanet, though most districts are between 2.5% and 3.5%. Dartford, Gravesham, Sevenoaks, Swale, Thanet, and Tonbridge and Malling, all reduced their proportions of NEET young people in June from the previous month. NEET proportions rose in Ashford, Dover, Maidstone, Shepway, and Tunbridge Wells, whilst they remained the same in Canterbury.

District performance for Not Knowns is less varied, and ranges from 3.0% in Shepway to 5.1% in Ashford. Only three districts reduced their Not Known figures this month (Dover, Shepway and Tunbridge Wells), which reflects the challenge at this time of year due to course end dates.

68% of NEET young people have been NEET for 27 weeks or more, up from 66% last month. In the same month last year this figure was 72%, so there has been some progress in tackling the long-term NEET population.

Further analysis is taking place to gain detailed insight into specific vulnerable groups within the NEET and Not Known cohorts, in order to target their support in the most appropriate way possible, in particular those young people who are caring for their own child, and those with Special Educational Needs.

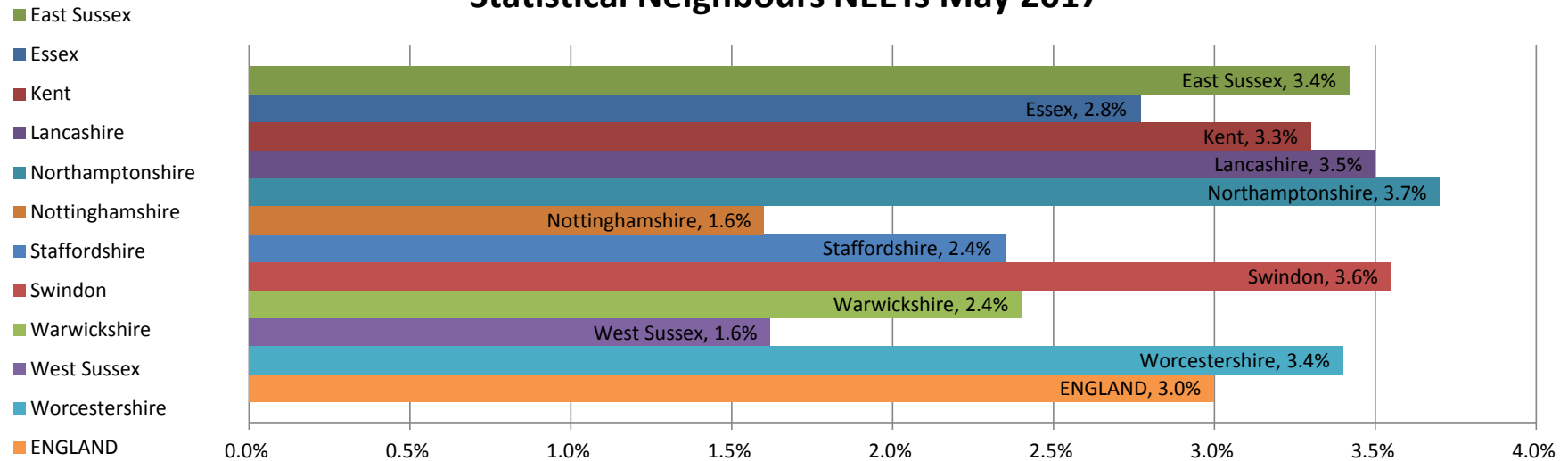

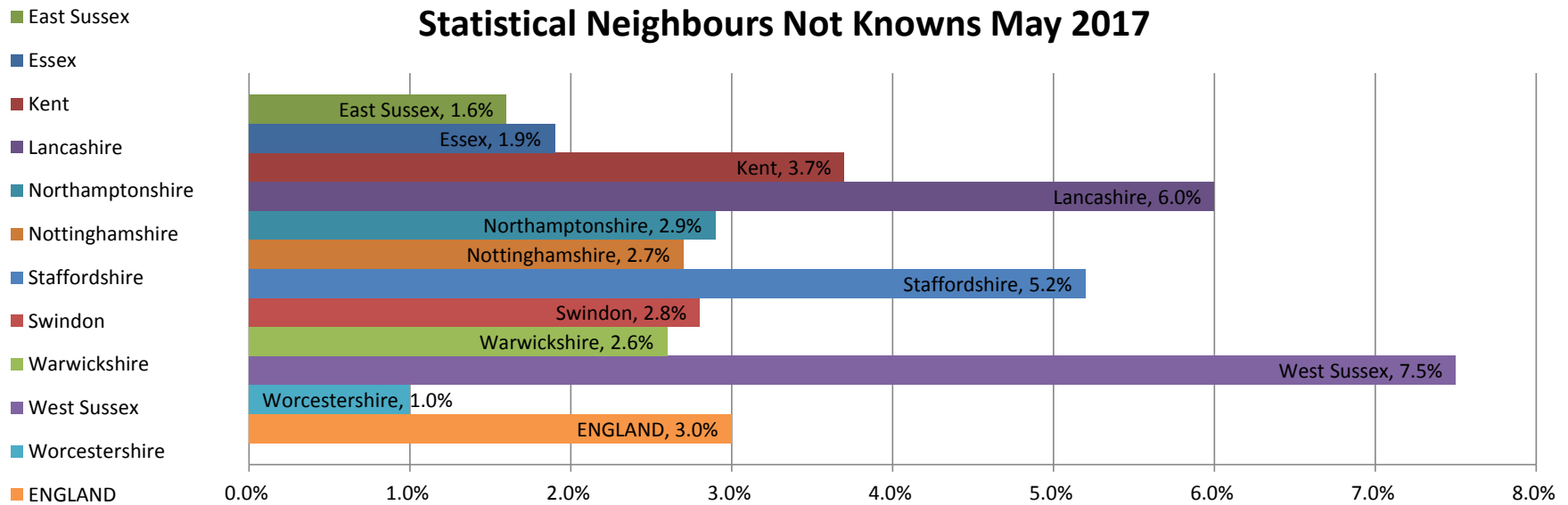
