This means ensuring young people will leave school with sufficient skills and knowledge to enter the toughest exam anyone, and everyone, will have to sit: LIFE!

- As a campaign:
 - Within KYCC, one of our 3 campaign groups
 - The one devolved campaign of UKYP
- Why it is important:
 - ⅓ of adults not voting in 2015 election
 - Adults across the UK being, on average, in £30,000 of debt
 - 140,000 people dying from incidents that could have been saved by first aid
- Why this is a campaign:
 - 12 Subjects have statutory status but not PSHE!
 - If PSHE is taught, not adequately according the PSHE Association and Ofsted



Financing for Life

How to Vote

Before you are able to vote, you must register to be on the electoral register. You can register online www.gov.uk/register-to-vote.

Registering to vote is easy: it will take roughly five minutes of your time to vote online, and only a few details are necessary. You must be at least 16 to register and all you need is your National insurance number and you only need to register once unless you are changing your personal details.

Who Can Vote

Almost everyone can vote however, you must: be a British Citizen

· be 18 (for General Election)

- There are a few different ways that you can vote. These are:
- · in person at a polling station
- · by proxy (getting someone else to vote for you)



We believe that it was important to identify the subjects that young people want within schools so

that hopefully within time curriculum can be altered to fit young people's needs. The highest voted was career advice with 399 votes. This is critically important as lots of young people complete school with little knowledge of what they want to do in the future so it can be hard to stay motivated in school. Increasing the ability for young people to discover their career could increase their motivation in work. Then followed: knowledge of finance would include taxes and interest rates etc. This is vital

for young people as it would mean that less young people are brought into debt when they go into employment as they would have a firmer understanding of how finances work. Home economics would also be vital as it would include sills such as how to change a plug which could mean that young people are more equipped live independently.

As well as the main subjects we asked if students wanted they also had the chance to suggest other subjects they desired:

- 22 young people wanted more education on health related problems such as alcohol and drug abuse.
- 29 young people wanted to be taught practical skills such as self-defence, map reading and cooking.
- And 12 people wanted more emphasis on citizenship issues such as the LGBTQ+ community, philosophy, human rights and world issues.
