Kent Association of Early Years and Childcare Providers

Terms of Reference

Purpose

- To promote a <u>strategic and effective partnership</u> between the Kent Early Years and Childcare Sector, Kent County Council (KCC) and The Education People, in working towards the very best early years and childcare provision in Kent.
- To work in collaboration with KCC and The Education People in determining the <u>strategic</u> <u>direction</u> for the ongoing development and improvement of early years and childcare provision and services in Kent.
- To provide an <u>interface between KCC and The Education People and early years and childcare</u> <u>providers</u> in order to promote a coherent approach to ensure a sufficient, sustained, high quality and inclusive early years and childcare market in Kent.
- To liaise with other local, regional and national partners and agencies appropriate and necessary, to be a <u>representative voice</u> for the Kent Early Years and Childcare Sector.
- To support the <u>continuing development of partnership working</u> between KCC and The Education People and providers, including formal collaborations, networks and alliances that support holistic improvement.

Membership

Membership to include the following representation:

- Of providers from
 - ✓ each district
 - ✓ each type of constitution i.e. private, voluntary, independent, maintained (i.e. schools)
 - ✓ each type of provision i.e. early years group sessional, full day care, year round, term time only, out of school, childminders
- Kent County Council
- The Education People.

The nature of representation is that each member contributes a representative voice rather than necessarily representing the views of the relevant district/provider type etc. In addition to names representatives, other Education People and/or KCC officers may attend meetings from time to time in relation to particular issues being discussed but will not form part of the actual membership.

Operational Issues

- Scheduled meetings will routinely take place quarterly, typically meetings in September, December, March and June; Additional meetings may be called if required.
- Provider representatives will be selected via a geographically based election process and typically serve a three year term.
- The Association will have its Chair and Vice Chair elected from within the body of the Association.
- Meetings will be administrated by The Education People on the behalf of KCC
- Communication back to the Early Years and Childcare Sector will be through the established route of the Early Years and Childcare Bulletin and/or Briefing and Networking Sessions and/or KCC's and The Education People's websites
- Provider Association meetings quoracy require at least 50% of members to be present in order to be able to make decisions.

Members of the Association will be expected to:

- Attend scheduled meetings other than in exceptional circumstances
- Where possible attend Early Years and Childcare Briefing Networking Sessions to gather the views of providers on strategic issues to be raised
- Champion the Association and its work
- Maintain confidentiality as appropriate and necessary
