

Year 7 Catch-up Premium Grant 2014 to 2015: Conditions of Grant

1. The Year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up premium grant 2014 to 2015 will be paid pursuant to Section 14 of the Education Act 2002, and in accordance with Section 16 of that Act the Secretary of State lays down the following terms and conditions on which assistance is given in relation to this grant for the financial year beginning 1 April 2014.

Basis of Allocation

2. The Year 7 catch-up premium allocations for 2014 to 2015 are based on £500 for each pupil as follows:

Pupils on the School Census

- a Year 7 pupil as recorded on the October 2014 school census; or
- a pupil recorded as in Year Group X and aged 11 on the October 2014 census,

and

• recorded in the 2014 Key Stage 2 assessment data.as **not** having achieved level 4, 5 or 6 in reading or mathematics

Pupils on the alternative provision census

- a pupil recorded on the January 2014 alternative provision census as a Year 7 pupil, or
- a pupil recorded in Year Group X and aged 11 on the January 2014 alternative provision census;

and

• is recorded in the 2013 Key Stage 2 assessment data as **not** having achieved level 4, 5 or 6 in reading or mathematics

Allocations to local authorities and schools

3. Each local authority's allocation covers schools that on 1 January were:

maintained schools,

maintained special schools; and

pupil referral units

plus an allocation for alternative provision pupils (see paragraphs 2 and 7).

4. EFA allocations direct to schools cover schools that on 1 January were:

academies

free schools,

special academies,

special free schools,

alternative provision academies

alternative provision free schools

City Technology Colleges

Studio Schools

University Technology Colleges

Terms on which the Year 7 catch-up premium is allocated to schools

5. The grant may be spent by maintained schools and academies for the purposes of the school; that is to say for the educational benefit of pupils registered at that school, or for the benefit of pupils registered at other maintained schools and academies; and on community facilities, for example services whose provision furthers any charitable purpose for the benefit of pupils at the school or their families, or people who live or work in the locality in which the school is situated.

6. The grant does not have to be completely spent by schools and academies in the financial year beginning 1 April 2014; some or all of it may be carried forward to future financial years.

7. The grant must be made available irrespective of the existence of any deficit relating to the expenditure of the school's budget share. The Year 7 catch-up premium is not part of schools' budget shares and is not part of the Individual Schools Budget. It is not to be counted for the purpose of calculating the Minimum Funding Guarantee.

Pupils in alternative provision

8. The grant has also been allocated to each local authority for pupils in alternative provision (ie attending schools not maintained by the local authority¹ for which the local authority is paying full tuition fees, plus all pupils educated otherwise than in schools under arrangements made by the local authority). This ensures there are funds to provide catch-up support for any Year 7 pupils in alternative provision who did not achieve level 4 in reading and/or mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2.

Payment arrangements

9. The grant will be paid by the Secretary of State to local authorities by 27 February 2015. The payment will include allocations for all schools that are maintained schools on 1 January 2015, including schools that might convert to academy status after 1 January 2015. Schools that are academies or free schools on 1 January 2015 will be paid direct by the EFA on 2 March 2015.

Certification

10. Local authorities will be required to certify that they have passed on the correct amount of funding to schools or, where funding has been spent centrally, that it has been spent in line with the conditions of grant. The certificate will be issued to local authorities in April 2015 for completion and return to the EFA by 31 May 2015.

Variation

11. The basis for allocation of grant may be varied by the Secretary of State from those set out above.

Overpayments

12. Any overpayment of grant shall be repaid by the local authority or academy to the Secretary of State.

Further information

13. That the books and other documents and records relating to the recipient's accounts shall be open to inspection by the Secretary of State and by the Comptroller and Auditor

General. The Comptroller and Auditor General may, pursuant to Section 6 of the National Audit Act 1983, carry out examinations into the economy, efficiency and effectiveness with which the recipient has used its resources in discharging its grant-aided activities.

14. The grant recipient shall provide such further information as may be required by the Secretary of State for the purpose of determining whether it has complied with the conditions set out in this document.

Other conditions

15. If the grant recipient fails to comply with the conditions set out in the paragraphs above, the Secretary of State may require the repayment of the whole or any part of the grant monies paid as may be determined by the Secretary of State and notified in writing to the grant recipient. Such sum as has been notified shall immediately become payable to the Secretary of State.



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
