We have several short updates for you that we hope will be helpful to you and your teams.

# Test and Track

We have recently had some schools raise concerns related to inconsistent advice being provided to them or to their staff in instances where positive cases have been confirmed linked to the school or to a family member. In one case, this arose from a notification being received through the Test and Track system. Where a school is concerned that the advice received or action required does not comply with government guidance, particularly where notification has come through Test and Track, Public Health England have suggested that individual cases should be picked up by raising it here <a href="https://www.nhs.uk/contact-us/nhs-website-contact-us">https://www.nhs.uk/contact-us/nhs-website-contact-us</a> or through calling 119 to check and challenge the advice.
